

BRITON RULES HUN COLONY

LONDON, Oct. 1.—(By the Associated Press).—Sir Horace Byatt, administrator of what was formerly German East Africa, soon will leave England for Dar-es-Salaam, which will be the new headquarters of the government under the mandate of the League of Nations. Various government officials have been appointed for administering the new territory but it will be some time before the staff will be complete and the "new broom" start sweeping.

Meanwhile it is reported all is going smoothly. The old German native army has melted away and the country is now garrisoned by three battalions of King's African Rifles from the neighboring colonies. The only Germans left are a few of the original settlers, the majority having been repatriated. Since they departed there have been no disturbances among the native inhabitants, who are said to have taken kindly to the change of rulers.

The railways, which were much damaged by the Germans, have been repaired right up to Lake Tanganyika. The most urgent need of the colony is the resumption of shipping, coastwise and with Europe, for on this the prosperity of the country chiefly depends.

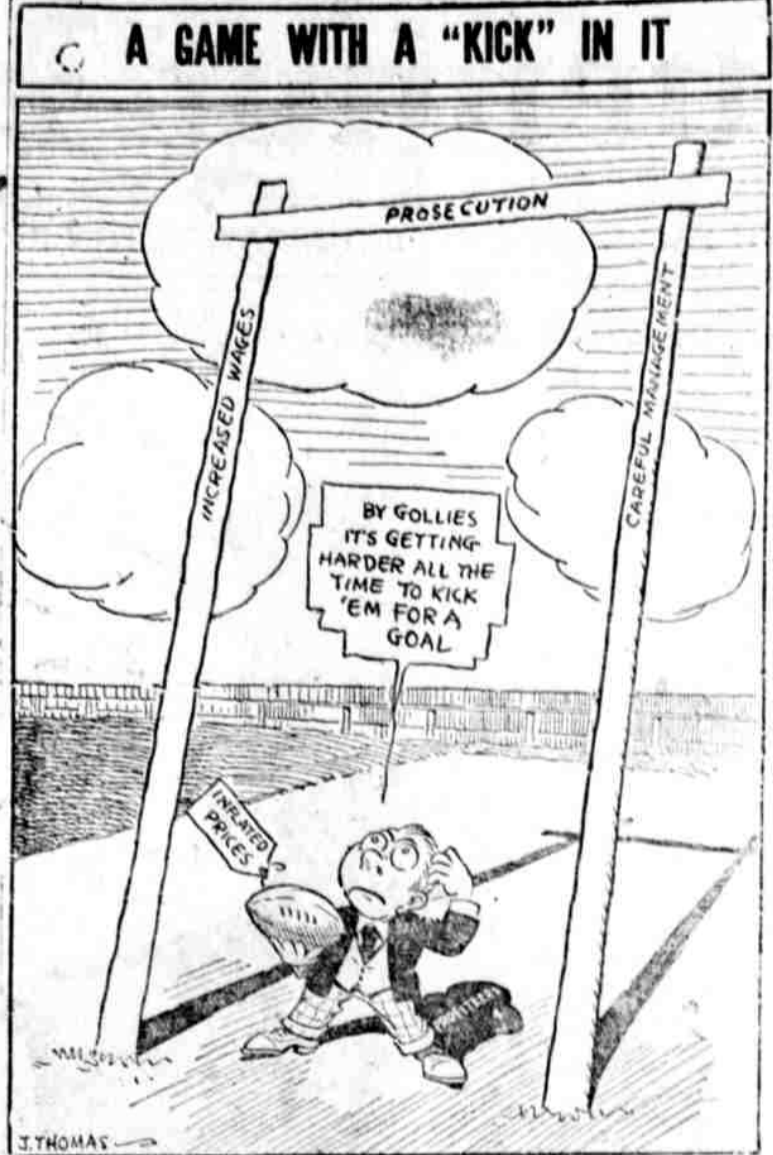
DAIRY STARS TO BE SHOWN

C., informed True that the federal exhibit of the Bureau of Animal Industry at the National Dairy Show at Chicago will be shipped to the California Building at the Panama-Pacific Exposition grounds for the California International.

Manufacturers and distributors of milk and milk products will compete for honors in the showing of the different makes and grades of butter, cheese, milk and cream, and the latest in dairy and barn equipment will occupy the greater part of the big ball room which was the scene of many festivities during the Panama-Pacific exposition.

The dairy herds of the West have been proclaimed by Eastern judges to be the finest in the country and this show will bring together the best of them in competition that will be the keenest.

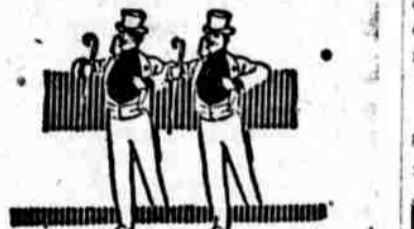
