LONDON, Sept. 26.—(By the Associated Press)

Some of the soldiers who served in the great war are finding the humdrum life of the civilian too monotonous to endure and offering to risk their lives in campaigns anywhere or in any adventure to escape the tedium of office or shop life. An example is shown in the following advertisement which appeared in the London papers the other day: "Young ex-soldier, three times wounded, will risk life for 200 pounds, tired of life and all alone; write," etc.

Inquiry disclosed that the advertiser was formerly a stretcher bearer in the Royal Army medical corps, who won the military medal at Mar tinpauch and later at Ypres won a bar to the medal. After his discharge he obtained employment as a civilian clerk in the royal air force. "I am paid 3 pounds a week," he told an interviewer, "but I am ashamed to take it. For weeks I have not done a stroke of work. Doing nothing all day is getting on my nerves. I cannot stand it and I want action. Perhaps some cinema firm might want somebody for a particularly risky job." Recently four officers advertised themselves as ready to enlist in any capacity in any campaign for any country, provided there was "some fighting to be done."
