REORGANIZATION OF AUSTRALIAN DEFENSE SYSTEM

SYDNEY, Australia, Sept. 9.—(By Mail).—Important and far-reaching reforms in the defense system of Australia are advocated in a report now being considered by the federal cabinet. The report is the work of an advisory committee of experts, several of whom held commands at or near the front during the war. The committee points out that, with the world in its present condition of unrest, there is no real guarantee against war, and it

emphasizes the vulnerable position of Australia.

It recommends a concentrated course of citizen force training covering perhaps three months a year under conditions approximating those of war. It further recommends organization of the commonwealth military forces on divisional lines and the formation of machine gun and other new units sufficient to constitute six infantry and two cavalry divisions; establishment of divisional headquarters and skilled skeleton staff; an air service, and development of aerial activities to insure a reserve stock of ammunition and to enable Australia to manufacture munitions.
