HOSPITAL PHARMACY WILL BE MODERN

Frank Robinson, who has been with the Star Drug company for the last six months, will leave next week for San Francisco to purchase stock and laboratory equipment for the pharmacy, which he intends to establish in the new hospital which is being erected by Dr. Warren Hunt at Fourth and Pine streets and which will be ready for occupancy about January 1.

The pharmacy will supply all the prescriptions used in connection with the institution. Prompt service in emergencies constantly arising frequently means everything to the patient and the establishment of the dispensary is a modern step in hospital management found only in leading hospitals. Mr. Robinson intends to purchase a full stock of drugs and all laboratory apparatus necessary to make his department of the hospital efficient and up-to-date.

"We sell almost as many cigarettes to women as to men," said one. "Frequently men customers, after buying cigars and tobacco for themselves, ask for cigarettes for their wives. Clergymen who do not themselves smoke come in and ask for a hundred Turkish cigarettes for their womenfolk."

"Cigarette smoking has not yet become fashionable among working-class women, but in the middle and upper classes I imagine that the husband who quarrels with the wife because she smokes must be a rare bird."
