JOFFRE APPLAUDS WANNER OPERA

PARIS, Oct. 1. (By The Associated Press.)—Marshal Joffre has returned from a visit to the occupied territory of Germany where he was received with the greatest enthusiasm by the Belgians, British, American and French soldiers. The Germans rendered to him the honor which heretofore had been reserved for the former emperors when the Marshal and Madame Joffre attended a performance at the Mayence Opera House.

It was one of Wagner's operas, so repugnant to Parisian civilians, that the first marshal of France honored with his presence. There had been a long established custom in Germany that whenever the Emperor attended the opera, no applause should begin until royalty gave the signal. The Germans awaited the Marshal's good pleasure before manifesting their approval. Joffre did not applaud until the second act and the artists' rendition of the first act was given amidst complete silence.

On the train returning to Paris, Joffre summoned the newspaper correspondents who had accompanied him on his tour and one of them, a financial reporter broached the subject of exchange. The Marshal listened gravely while the expert explained to him why the dollar was worth nine francs and the pound about thirty-six and then said: "It is peculiar. During the war, between the Allies, blood was at par."

CARRANZA IS TIRELESS RIDER

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 4. (By The Associated Press.)—Correspondents accompanying President Carranza on his trip to the northern part of the republic are willing to concede him first honors as a hardy and tireless horseman despite his sixty years. The President has visited several ranches in Coahuila and Nuevo Leon, making these trips on horseback.

One correspondent tells of a forty-five mile ride across the desert, without water and through vision-obscuring dust. At the end of this strenuous ride the President clattered into the little village where he was to spend the night, yards ahead of several of his hardest military men. He apparently suffered no ill effects from the unusual exercise.

Several times the party was caught by darkness on the desert. Camp was pitched and by the light of a log fire, the chief executive of Mexico ate his supper and then rolled into his blankets for a night's rest. Inasmuch as President Carranza has scarcely been away from the national palace for a year, surprise is expressed at his endurance. It is said that the former rancher for he was a prosperous rancher before revolution made him a president, still finds his keenest pleasures out-of-doors, and is looking forward to the time when he can return to his farm interests in Coahuila and live again the bucolic life.
