RAIL EXTENSION
PLAN DELAYED

Financing of the Strahorn rail-
road extension from Bend to its
present terminus in Klamath county
will have to wait for the return of
the railroads of the country to pri-
vate ownership on January, accord-
ing to decision reached by the board
of directors of the Portland Cham-
ber of Commerce on report of a spe-
cial committee appointed recently to
look into the situation, says the Por-
tland Telegram. The committee con-
sidered the time now as inopportune
to launch any movement toward ob-
taining the necessary financial back-
ing.
The board adopted the report of
the committee with the special un-
derstanding that the proposal is not
to be discontinued but that as soon
as the railroads are returned to pri-
vate management and railroad se-
curities are given their proper
standing a plan should be devel-
oped to aid this project.
