PERSIAN RULER ENTERTAINED IN ENGLISH COURT

LONDON, Nov. 11.—(By the Associated Press)—The state banquet given by King George and Queen Mary at Buckingham Palace in honor of the young Shah of Persia on the night of the arrival of the eastern monarch in England was an occasion of regal splendor.

The dinner was served in the great ballroom, the "U" shaped table being set for about 120 guests. The walls were decorated with old tapestries, and yeomen of the guards stood at intervals about the apartment.

The Shah, wearing a diamond adorned fez, sat between the King and Queen, Princess Mary, Prince Arthur of Connaught, and many other notables were in the company.

Queen Mary's gown was a magnificent affair, of rose-pink mirror velvet trimmed with sable. She wore a diadem of brilliants which included "The Lesser Stars of Africa," cut from the original Cutlun diamond. She also wore a Persian Order across her breast.

King George expressed pleasure at welcoming the Shah to England and said he fully appreciated the fact that Persia occupied a position of vital importance in the Middle East. A bright future should lie before her.

"You follow in the footsteps of your illustrious great-grandfather and grandfather, who visited this country on more than one occasion," said the King. "We welcome your majesty's present visit here as a renewed proof of the close ties of friendship which have united the two countries for more than a century. We welcome it more especially at the present moment when the relations between Persia and Great Britain have become even closer than they have ever been, and when we are about to embark upon a collaboration in the field of material and administrative progress which should ensure to your country a future not unworthy of its famous past."

The Shah replied in French, expressing his appreciation of the welcome extended to him. In the course of his address he referred to the League of Nations and said it would afford to his country the opportunity of cultivating more assiduously than ever the traditional friendship which united it to the British Empire.

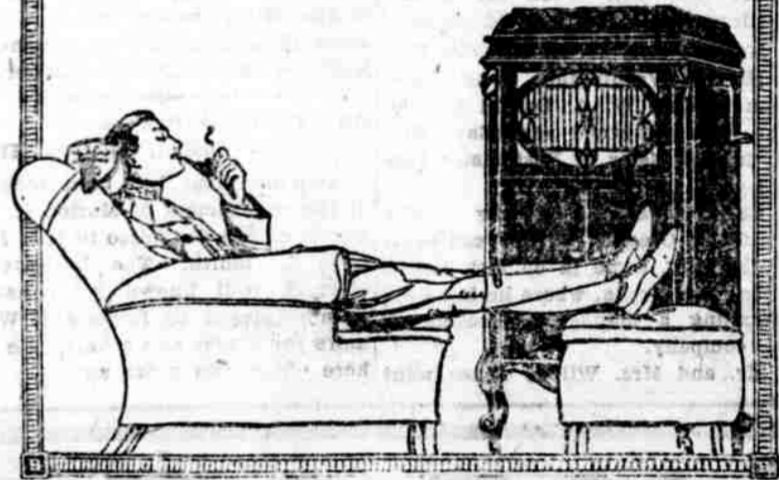

RUSSIANS LIKE PRISON LIFE

PHOENIX, Ariz., Dec. 2.—A great many Russians who fought in the armies of the former Czar Nicholas prefer life in a German military prison camp to an uncertain existence in their own land, according to Capt. G. V. Gill, who recently returned to the United States from Berlin where he was engaged in special work for the Inter-Allied Commission. For six months Captain Gill worked among Russian prisoners of war in Germany, examining them for symptoms of tuberculosis and seeing that those affected were given proper care.

"Six hundred thousand Russians were held as prisoners of war in Germany when I went there last March," Captain Gill said. "When I left, about 2000 had been repatriated by the Inter-Allied Commission. In the interval conditions in German prison camps had been improved greatly. Good food was being served the prisoners when I left in September and the general rules of sanitation were being observed."

Captain Gill said many Russians who were repatriated by the Inter-Allied Commission returned to the strict discipline of the German prison camps in preference to afflicting themselves with "free society" under soviet government in their own country.

On his return to this country Capt. Gill was assigned to Whipple Barracks, Prescott, Arizona.

HAMBURG LINES WILL RESUME

RIO DE JANEIRO, Nov. 8.—(By Mail).—Letters received in Porto Alegre from German firms in Hamburg state that immediately upon the conclusion of peace, freight and passenger steamship service will be resumed between Hamburg and the Rio Grande.

Porto Alegre is the capital of the State of Rio Grande do Sul, one of the most prosperous states in the union. A large proportion of the population is German.

Before the war large quantities of fruit, grain and meat products were exported to Germany from the state by direct lines of steamers. The letters just received from Hamburg stated that it was proposed to resume this trade, especially as Germany was sorely in need of the food-stuffs which Rio Grande do Sul produced in abundance.
