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RECLAMATION ASSOCIATION SEEKS \$3000

The Western States Reclamation association has been organized as a result of the conference held November 21 and 22 at Salt Lake City. Representatives from 13 of the reclamation states were present at the conference, which was called for the purpose of crystallizing sentiment in the Western states in favor of some definite plan of furthering federal reclamation. The association decided to request of Congress an appropriation of \$250,000,000 to replenish the reclamation fund. Provision was made for an executive committee composed of one member from each state to carry out the recommendations of the association. State Engineer Percy A. Cupper was selected as executive committeeman from Oregon.

The first meeting of the executive committee was held in Salt Lake City following the conference, and it is proposed to hold the next meeting in Washington, D. C., soon after the convening of Congress.

It is proposed to raise the necessary funds for carrying on the campaign by voluntary subscription. Oregon's allotment is \$3000. The importance of this movement to Oregon can hardly be overestimated. Any substantial additions to the U. S. reclamation fund will not only permit of additional construction work by the Reclamation Service, but it will also greatly stimulate irrigation under the irrigation district plan, which is proving so successful in Oregon. It is believed that the government will receive the support of every irrigation and drainage enterprise in the state, on account of its far-reaching effect. Even though a project may not be in a position to directly receive federal aid, the fact that the Reclamation Service is in the field will make it much easier for such projects to secure the necessary finances from private sources. We are undoubtedly entering upon an era of unprecedented development along the lines of irrigation and drainage, and by putting up a united front will now have an opportunity of greatly advancing the cause.

It seems that an opportunity is now being presented whereby Oregon may be able to secure her full share of federal development, particularly if the irrigation interests give whole-hearted support to the movement initiated by the Western States Reclamation association at the Salt Lake City conference.

NAVY WILL PAY FOR GOOD IDEAS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3.—The navy will pay a cash reward for usable ideas or suggestions submitted by civilian employees or persons in civil life.

Regulations to carry out the act of Congress authorizing such payments have been based on the methods adopted by industrial establishments. The naval inventions office will supply forms on request for the submission of suggestions.

The act states that "reward is to be paid when, due to a suggestion or a series of suggestions, there results an improvement or economy in manufacturing process or plant or naval material."

The department warns employees and civilians against making "frivolous" suggestions.

GERMANY FIXES INCOME TAX

BERLIN, Oct. 15.—(By Mail).—A commission of the national assembly has agreed to a sliding scale in the assessment of private incomes for the empire's emergency.

It provides for a levy of 10 per cent on the first 50,000 marks and 12 per cent on the second 50,000 marks. Fortunes of 1,000,000 marks are to be taxed 50 per cent, while multi-millionaires are assessed as high as 65 per cent.
