## BIG ARIZONA WATER PROJECT

PHOENIX, Arizona, Dec. 4.—Reclamation of more large areas of land in Arizona by means of irrigation projects became a strong probability when the state land commission, acting in conjunction with officials of the United States Reclamation Service, decided on an investigation and a final report on salient facts concerning five irrigation projects. Three are in San Carlos, San Francisco river and Red Rock river projects. Two others are to be reported later, the commission announced. A \$30,000 appropriation was made available for the investigation and report.

The San Carlos dam site is located on the Gila river, in Arizona, and the project contemplates the reclamation of an estimated 100,000 acres, possibly more, chiefly in Pinal county between the towns of Florence and Casa Grande.

The Red Rock site is located in New Mexico in a position commanding irrigable lands in Arizona on the mesa south of Franklin, Greenlee county.

The San Francisco dam site also is in New Mexico, near Alma, and it is proposed for development as an auxiliary to the San Carlos project.

The state's part in these enterprises is one of co-operation with the United States Reclamation Service.
