Horace G. Shidler has begun suit in the circuit court against Klamath county and George L. Humphrey, to cancel two tax certificates and secure a decree quieting title of the land involved. The certificates cover taxes for 1913 and 1914, at which time plaintiff alleges he had not received a patent to the land and it was still the property of the United States government. On this basis he asks for cancellation of the certificates and enjoinder against defendants' further effort to collect the tax.
