Douglas Fairbanks has a suitcase full of brand new stunts that he introduces in his next picture, "The Knickerbocker Buckaroo," which is to be shown at the Star Theatre tonight.

Douglas has been in constant training with Bull Montana, Spike Robinson and Kid McCoy and, to quote the screen athlete, "I was in the pink of condition when I made this film."
