NEAR EAST IS FARING BETTER A. P. REPORTS

TIFLIS, Transcaucasia, Nov. 25.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press.)—Colonel William Haskell, High Commissioner for the Four Great Powers in Armenia, believes that one of the most difficult questions of the Near East has been solved by settlement of the dispute between Armenia, Azerbaidjan district.

(This district lies between the Black and Caspian seas, just north of the former border of Persia and Transcaucasia. Representatives of the three countries named have agreed to settle the dispute over this territory and to adjust all further disagreements by conference.) Colonel Haskell told The Associated Press that this settlement opens a much greater field of work for

the American Committee for Relief in the Near East.

"This organization," he said, "already is housing, feeding and clothing 11,000 orphans in 42 orphanages scattered throughout Russian Armenia besides caring for 23,000 sick children, maintaining fourteen hospitals and feeding 397,000 homeless refugees or destitute persons. Fed 61,000 Refugees.

"Before the recent conflict of Zangebour, the Americans fed 61,000 refugees in the neighborhood of Shusha, the capital of the disputed district. Even then they were unable to reach 58,000 more in the mountainous region known as Karabagh who were cut off by the political complications now settled.

"It is now hoped to bring relief to more than 100,000 Armenians and Tartars alike in the contested territory who face death this winter unless outside help is received.

"The United States is the only country endeavoring to help the population of all Transcaucasia, besides whose desperate situation the condition in devastated France and Belgium is described as simply child's play. Fifty thousand Armenians who were left in Turkey are arriving at

Erivan, Kars and Alexandropol by dribbles, clothe in bits of torn sack—piled together with their bodies frightfully emaciated. The stomachs of tiny children are grotesquely swollen from living on roots and herbs. These children are fit only for treatment in hospitals where only a long course of most careful feeding can remake them into human beings.

Hundreds Homeless

"Around every station along the railway are gathered groups of hundreds of homeless people lying huddled together on the ground, the majority of them too weak even to try to help themselves, from time to time the stronger ones climb on freight cars and move elsewhere, always seeking better conditions which do not exist. Two hundred and sixty-three thousand homeless refugees from Turkish Armenia thus are constantly milling about throughout Russian Armenia, making the relief work conducted by the Americans, a problem requiring infinite patience and organizing ability.

"This is especially true in view of the existence of 248,000 destitute inhabitants of Russian Armenia who possessed homes but no food as well as 150,000 Greeks, Russians, Persians, Syrians and Yezidis who have been driven out of parts of Transcaucasia.

"One hundred and forty thousand Moslems whose villages were destroyed in the course of five years of constant warfare are helplessly encamped in the open around villages of their former enemies, begging infinitesimal quantities of flour which they mix with dirt to give the illusion of nourishment.

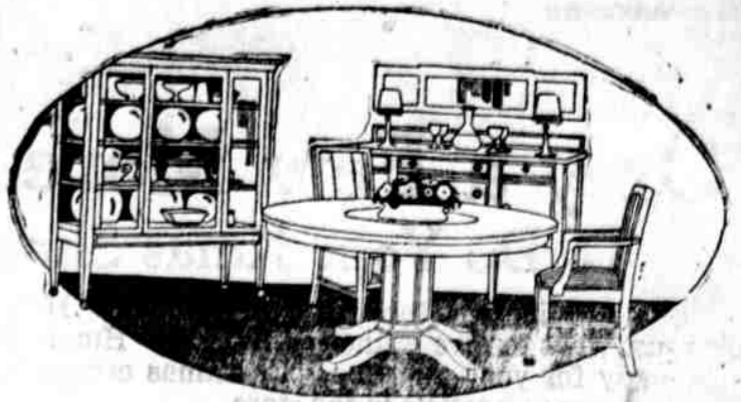
"These hundreds of thousands of suffering adults, mostly homeless and lacking every necessity of life, having nothing more to lose, are concentrated in a country as yet inadequately policed or governed. They constitute a fertile field for the seeds of Bolshevism of any form of anarchy, the spread of which once loosed would be impossible to predict.

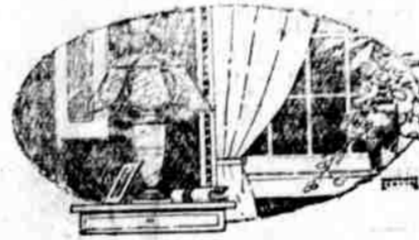

the cause of the banditry, sporadic revolutions, local conflicts and general political unrest throughout the Caucasus of which ambitious and unscrupulous elements are almost certain to take advantage sooner or later. The present economic situation in Transcaucasia already has prompted the Georgian government to order all temporary residents of Tiflis who are unable to show that they are employed and earning enough to feed themselves and their families to leave the city as the supply of foodstuffs will be insufficient.

"Georgia hopes in this way to eliminate 100,000 non-productive mouths and to conserve the present limited supply of food for the working population of the capital.

Many Out of Work

"About 45,000 wage-earners in the Baku oil wells now are unemployed owing to cessation of the exportation of oil. This has forced the Azerbaidjan government to take a similar step.

"If these 145,000 are driven out of Tiflis and Baku they will have nowhere else to go and must inevitably be added to the number of homeless wanderers whom none unless Americans are able or willing to feed. The Near East relief supplies now on hand are sufficient only until January and are wholly inadequate to meet this new drain upon the existing resources.

"It is generally admitted in the Caucasus that the Americans of the Near East Relief Committee already have saved the lives of at least 30,000 babies and children and of 500,000 adult refugees and destitute. This work still is continuing."
