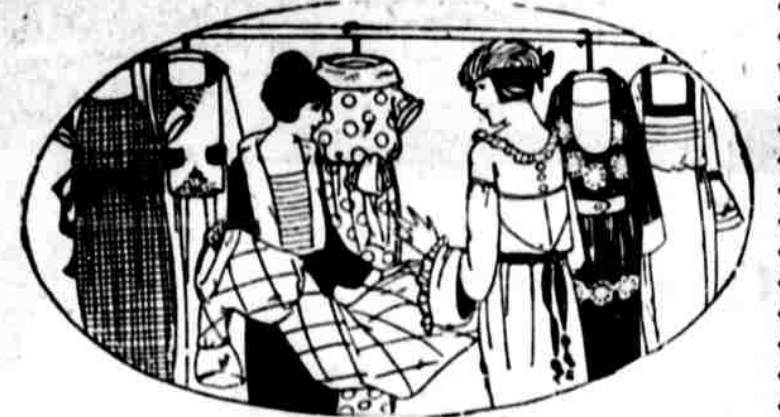

PAYS TRIBUTE TO BRITISH AIRMEN

BERLIN, Dec. 19.—"Greater than the heroes of old," is the tribute to a British airman by Count Czernin, formerly Austro-Hungarian foreign minister.

"Baron Richthofen, the crack German airman, and an English airman were circling round each other furiously over the German lines in France during the war," he says, "when suddenly something went wrong with Richthofen's machine gun and he could not shoot. The Englishman looked across in surprise and, seeing what was wrong, waved his hand, turned and flew off."

LANDING OF THE PILGRIMS WILL BE CELEBRATED

NEW YORK, Dec. 19.—The 300th anniversary of the Pilgrim Fathers, tentative plans of which have just been announced here, will include celebrations in England, Holland and the United States and will continue from May to December 1920.

A four-day program in Leyden, Amsterdam and Rotterdam, whences

the Pilgrims sailed three centuries ago to the American wilderness where they might find "freedom to worship God," will start on August 30, when committees from the United States and England will be received at the University of Leyden. Addresses commemorative of the occasion will be delivered by scholars from the three countries, including the rector of the university, Dr. Ren del Harris of Manchester, Eng., Viscount Bryce and a famous American who has not yet been designated.

The next day, August 31, the birthday of the Queen of the Netherlands, will include, beside a Congress in the Town Hall, a religious memorial service in the Pieterskirk in which the Rev. John Robinson, who led the separatists from the Church of England (the Pilgrims)

to Holland in 1609 was buried.

One of the features of the holiday at Amsterdam on September 1, will be a meeting in the Rijnsekerk and a reception. The next day there will be an aquatic pageant in Rotterdam, the visitors traveling in the morning from Leyden to Delftshaven, if possible, by boat along the way the Pilgrims went. Then there will be trips to the religious havens at Rotterdam, a memorial service in the church at Delftshaven and at 7 p. m. the English and American contingents will depart for Southampton.

The celebration in England will start in May 1920, with meetings in Scrooby, the home of Robinson, Austerfield, Boston and Sheffield. From August 4 to September 20 there will be ceremonies in Cambridge, London, Southampton and other places,

culminating in the sailing of the new Mayflower, which will carry the returning American committee and British and Dutch delegations who are to participate in the program on this side of the Atlantic.

Main events of the American celebration will be in Plymouth, Mass., and Boston, where historical pageants will be held, followed by a big reception in New York. Vice-president Marshall is Honorary Chairman of the committee having the local program in charge. The foreign visitors will then be taken on a tour of the United States. On Nov. 24, 1920, there will be a universal observance of Thanksgiving Day in England, Holland and the United States.
