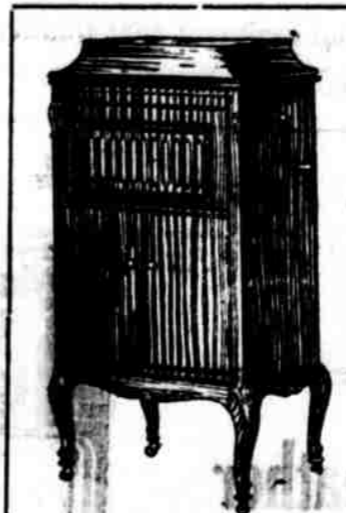

### IN THE DAYS NEWS

Viscount Milner, who has arrived in Cairo as head of the British mission to determine the nature of the new protectorate in Egypt, has had a distinguished career as a colonial administrator. He was under-secretary for Egypt in 1889-92, governor of the Cape of Good Hope in 1897-1901, governor of the Transvaal and Orange River Colony in 1901-1905, and, also, from 1897 to 1905, served as high commissioner for South Africa. In 1918 he served for a time as secretary of state for war in the British ministry. In early years Lord Milner was an important figure in British journalism. His best known book is "England in Egypt." He has long been an advocate of an Anglo-American union as a means of preserving the peace of the world.
