OREGON BREVITIES

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Or., Dec. 22.—Appointment of John Dubuis, graduate of Cornell university in civil engineering and from another institution in classical course, as an instructor of irrigation engineering has been announced.

THE DALLES, Or., Dec. 22.—The first amputation resulting from frozen limbs in this city occurred at the hospital when E. Clossen, a sheepherder, suffered the loss of a leg. It was frozen while the herder was on his range.

SALEM, Or., Dec. 22.—The state tax levy for 1920 is \$4,391,208, Frank K. Lovel, state tax commissioner has announced. This is based on the tax roll for 1919. Last year the levy was \$3,021,402.

The levy for 1920 is \$1,188,722.56 in excess of the 6 per cent tax limitation. The excess was authorized by the people at the special election last June in passing the state

PORTLAND, Dec. 22.—Mrs. Grace Beardsley, of Columbia boulevard, won first prize on a dozen eggs displayed at the Oregon Poultry and Pet Stock association show this week.

SALEM, Or., Dec. 22.—"Wild Bill," the big bull elk at the state fair grounds, died by the bullet of the executioner early because of numerous crimes committed against his kind and attacks he has made on persons entering his pen.

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 22.—Twelve persons were injured, several seriously, when an inbound Newport Beach car crashed into the rear end of a Pacific Electric ten car freight train at Dominguez Junction near here and was derailed. Failure of

brakes on the passenger car was blamed for the accident.

MEMINNVILLE, Ore., Dec. 22.—A brief and not very complete survey of the city has induced the estimate of those making the survey that the recent cold spell has cost the citizens of McMinville in loss of fruit, potatoes and apples frozen and destroyed, and in plumbing bills and damage from explosions an average of \$100 for each family.

PORTLAND, Dec. 22.—Additional pledges by banks to take the limit of war savings certificates, in response to the appeal of C. S. Hudson, president of the Oregon Bankers' association, have come in from thirteen banks, making \$18,000 to add to the \$26,000 previously reported. The latest subscribing banks are: First National, of The Dalles, and Farmers & Merchants bank, of Stayton, \$3,000 each; Nestucca Valley bank, Cloverdale, \$2,000; First National of Prairie City; First State & Savings bank of Klamath Falls; First National of Marshfield; First State bank of Woodburn; Oregon State bank of Prineville; First National, of Ontario; Harney County National bank, of Burns and Gaston State bank of Gaston, \$1,000 each.

THE DALLES, Or., Dec. 22.—The false-work of the Deschutes bridge, on the route of the Columbia River highway, valued at approximately \$5,000 and taking five months to construct, was washed out by the recent heavy ice jam, according to highway workers who have appeared here.

ALBANY, Or., Dec. 22.—Efforts to resume work in the local schools amid record-breaking weather conditions have been abandoned and the schools were closed definitely until December 29.

SALEM, Or., Dec. 22.—Auction sales of blooded livestock probably will be added to the list of attractions at the Oregon state fair next year, according to A. H. Lea, secretary of the state fair board.
