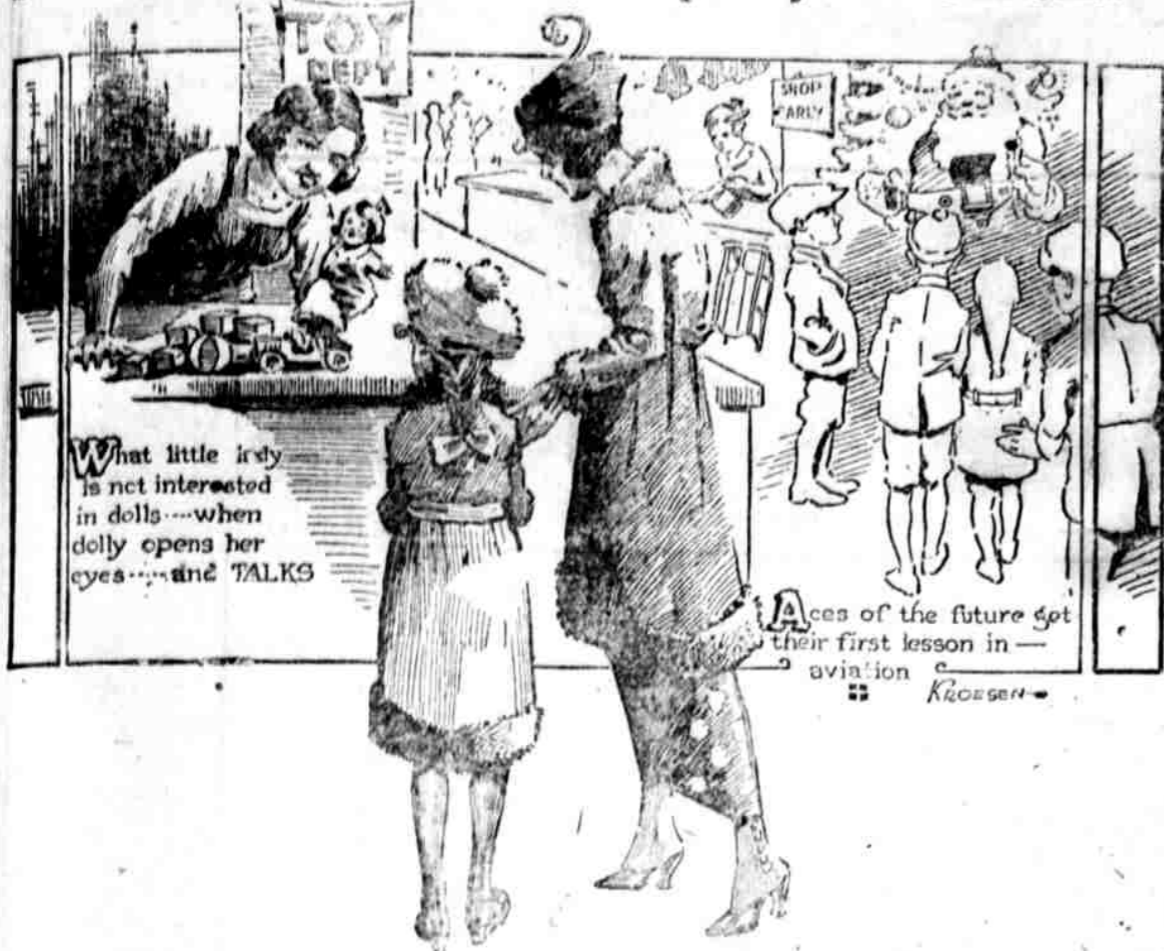

Sandwich Suggestions for Holiday Suppers

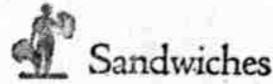
