OREGON BREVITIES

PORTLAND, Jan. 2 Fifty-two thousand passengers carried in 24,000 flights over a distance of 3,000,000 miles, and two fatalities—that is the record of the first six months of the British department of civil aviation, according to a synopsis issued by Major General Sir F. H. Sykes, controller general of civil aviation. These two aviators killed in accidents, according to Sykes' report, were pilots. Six other pilots and 10 passengers were injured in the 13 crashes reported.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Jan. 2 The call has been issued for the sixth annual conference of the Oregon State Drainage association to convene at Corvallis January 1 and 2.

This meeting is to be held at the Oregon Agricultural college during farmers' week and comes just ahead of the meeting of the Oregon Irrigation congress.

ASHLAND, Jan. 2 The Jackson county farm bureau held its annual meeting Friday, December 19. Mr. Mansfield, a prosperous farmer of Butte Falls, was elected president. Secretary's report showed a saving of between \$20,000 and \$50,000 to the county from the campaign on digger squirrels.

PORTLAND, Jan. 2—In spite of the lack of co-operation from groups of sportsmen in Jackson, Douglas and Multnomah counties, the present year has been the most successful one in the history of the Oregon fish and game commission, according to the annual report of Carl D. Shoemaker, state game warden. Mr. Shoemaker is now completing his annual report, which will be submitted to the commission within the next few days.

During the year there have been a total of 485 arrests and convictions, with fines aggregating \$16,094.80. This is more than \$5000 more than ever was received in fines in any other one year, while the number of arrests exceeds those of any other year by nearly 100. It is interesting to note that this record for game protection was attained with fewer warden than before, the report reveals.

TRAPS EXPERTS IN TOURNAMENT

RIVERSIDE, Cal., Jan. 2—Shotgun experts from all over the United States are here for the first annual trap-shooting tournament for what is to be known as the championship of America at 1000 16-yard targets.

This will be the first attempt on the Pacific coast to induce eastern shooters to come west for a winter event. If the tournament proves successful, it is planned to make it an annual affair.

Three trophies are being offered: one to the high man during the entire shoot and the other two to the leading members of the winning state teams.

Many entries already have been received from both amateur and professional experts with the latter in the majority.

Steps are under way for the formation of a woman's triangular debating league representing the University of Oregon, Willamette university and Oregon Agricultural college.

GENERAL COUNTY TAX LEVY IS 24.8 MILLS

The tax levy for the coming fiscal year was fixed by the county court Wednesday at 24.8 mills on the dollar, a reduction of two-tenths of a mill over last year, when the rate was an even 25 mills.

The new rate is figured on the 1919 valuation of \$117,623,692, and will raise a tax for all purposes of approximately \$409,000, or about \$4,000 less than the 1919 levy.

The budget adopted by the court calls for an expenditure of \$85,000 for roads and bridges. The resolution of adoption accepts the budget as advertised except a reduction of widows' pensions from \$9000 to \$8000,

and reduction of the warrant redemption fund \$58,000 to \$40,000.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 2—There are now 463,887 automobiles registered in the State of California, according to the latest figures obtained by the California State Automobile Association from the State Motor Vehicle Department. Motorcycles number 26,054 and there are 2,989 automobile dealers, 182 motorcycle dealers and 33,995 chauffeurs in the State.

EUREKA, Jan. 2—Specifications have been received here for contracts to supply 60,000 tons of rock for repairing and completing the south jetty at the entrance to Humboldt bay. Local contractors believe, owing to the details of the specifications, that it is the government's intention to commence the work early in the spring.

MARYSVILLE, Jan. 2—Confronted with telegrams showing that he is wanted in connection with a bank robbery in Spokane, Harold Simms, held as an auto bandit and the slayer of a Marysville bootblack, confessed to the bank robbery, according to an announcement by Sheriff C. J. McCoy.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 2—Public school pupils of San Francisco have saved \$500,000 in the last eight years, according to a report made by Philip J. Lawler, manager of the Bank of Italy's school savings department, to C. A. Farnsworth, associate director of the United States War Loan organization for the Twelfth Federal Reserve district. In 1911-1912 the bank started its thrift work in the schools, issuing school penny stamps. In the last two years Thrift and War Savings stamps have been sold in connection with the school penny stamps.
