## BOXERS ARE IN GOOD SHAPE

Billy Huff arrived in town today for his bout with George Fiddler at Houston's Opera House next Friday night. He states that he is in the pink of condition and expects to stop Fiddler in less time than it took to put Toby Miller to sleep last month. The smile on his face indicates that he is not at all worried about the outcome. Huff has been in training ever since his bout with Miller and is anxious to retain his title as champion of his class in this part of the country. The press dispatches indicate that Huff will have his hands full. Fiddler has put the quietus on a couple of middle weight aspirants since December 1st and says Huff will be easy picking after the men he has been up against in Portland and Seattle. Local fans who have seen Fiddler fight can see nothing better than a draw for Huff.

Elimination matches and try-outs are being held this afternoon to see who will be the lucky boys for the two preliminaries. The commission has been flooded with applications from men from this section of the country and it is believed that the fan who comes in too late for the curtain raisers will miss some of the snappiest boxing ever seen here.

Papke will be in Wednesday night and Stevens and Fiddler will arrive Thursday. It is rumored around town that Portland fans are coming especially to see Stevens fight as he is looked upon as one of the best in his class on the coast.

## TWO TRANSFERS OF LAND AT MERRILL

Considerable activity in Klamath county realty is shown by the records of transfers in the county recorder's office. The J. H. Loar ranch of 137 acres near Merrill is one of the several pieces of property to change hands. Burr Westbrook, a fancy stock grower of southern Texas, who has been in Klamath county for the last six or eight months looking for a suitable location, is the purchaser and will take possession immediately. Mr. Westbrook plans to go into the business of raising blooded sheep. The consideration reported in the deal is \$12,000.

Another transfer of Merrill land was made when G. W. Offield exchanged 120 acres of irrigated land in that section with R. C. Groesbeck, the local attorney, for a part of Mr. Groesbeck's reservation holdings. The Groesbeck land is situated on the east side of the Upper Lake and is fine grazing country. It will be used by Mr. Offield in extending his stock interests. The land received in return by Mr. Groesbeck is under lease at present and he will continue that form of investment. This was another \$12,000 deal, the parties on each side valuing their holdings at that figure.
