

The St. Louis, was christened by Mrs. Grover Cleveland. Her construction and launching was an epoch in American shipbuilding in that she was the first "ocean greyhound" to hot water for baths—plenty of heat —all outside rooms—rates \$2.50 to her first voyage in June of 1895. Under a contract with the American government she was entrusted with the fast mail of England and Europe.
