RED CROSS DIRECTS SIBERIAN RELIEF

TOKIO, Dec. 24. (By Mail).—The main work of relief in Siberia is in the hands of the American Red Cross, according to Colonel R. B. Tuesler, Red Cross Commissioner in Siberia. The British Red Cross, he said, has been obliged to leave Siberia, to answer urgent calls in Europe.

There were when it left 355 American relief workers in Siberia and of these 180 were American Red Cross nurses. They had 1,500 Russian assistants.

WOMEN LOSE.

LONDON, Jan. 28.—Women have lost their fight for equal rights with men to speak and pray before the general congregations in one conference of the Church of England. The Oxford diocesan convention has decided that they have no right to do so and that such conduct "had no precedent in the tradition of the church and was contrary to fundamental principles of faith and order."

BOOKS COLLECTED.

MANCHESTER, Eng. (Jan. 10.—(By Mail).—Twenty-one thousand books have already been collected here under the plan inaugurated in 1914 to help the University of Louvain, Belgium, replace its magnificent library which was destroyed at the outset of the war. Promises of help have been received about 250,000 volumes.
