### Telegraph Tabloids

LONDON, Feb. 3.—A definite peace treaty was concluded today between Esthonia and the Russian soviet government, a wireless message from Moscow announced.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 3.—The Georgetown university seismograph today recorded the heaviest earthquake in months, lasting more than two hours. It centered about 3,500 miles from Washington, the exact location unknown. It was heavier even than the recent Mexican upheaval.

PARIS, Feb. 3.—Lieutenant Funck, an Austrian employed in a bank here during the war, was executed today. He was accused of reporting to the Germans where their long range shells fell during the bombardment of Paris.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 3.—The supreme court today refused to review the cases of A. J. Partan and W. N. Reivo of Astoria, officials of the Western Workmen's Publishing company, convicted and sentenced to two years for violating the espionage act.

GRAND RAPIDS, Feb. 3.—James Murfin, attorney for Senator Newberry, on trial for fraud in connection with the last senatorial election, told the jury that he would show that Newberry entered the campaign at the solicitation of others and not in furtherance of a scheme to win a seat in the senate.
