**OPERATING FORDS IN COLD WEATHER**

"Ford operators can save themselves considerable trouble during cold weather if they give proper attention to the Ford clutch," said T. J. Mortell, special agent for the Standard Oil company, in discussing cold weather lubrication yesterday.

"Many Ford operators complain that when the engine is cold it is hard to crank and the car has a tendency to creep forward while cranking.

"To eliminate as much as possible this cause for complaint they should first make sure that the clutch throwout lever is adjusted so that, with the hand-brake lever set the clutch is fully disengaged. As this relieves the steel discs in the clutch of all pressure from the clutch spring, it should permit sufficient separation of the driving from the driven discs to allow them to turn freely on each other. This is necessary because the driving discs are connected to the engine crankshaft and the driven discs cannot revolve without turning the rear wheels. But if the lubricating oil used is of too heavy body, the discs will still have a tendency to stick together and make cranking difficult.

"In the Ford power plant the clutch is combined with the engine and lubricated from the supply of oil in the crankcase. If the oil in use has a zero cold test it will not congeal or become too heavy at any temperature above zero, and the clutch discs will then separate freely when relieved of the pressure of the clutch spring. This will permit the engine to be cranked with minimum effort, and will check the tendency of the car to creep forward.

**CITY HALL BUILT IN FIFTY YEARS**

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 5.—Payment for building the Philadelphia city hall has just been completed, although construction was started in 1872. The cost was \$25,000,000.

The city hall was built by a public building commission, authorized by the legislature in 1870. A four-mill tax for its construction was levied on all taxpayers in each of the following six years. At that time, however, the city did not have the power of lien for taxes and, as a result, part of the building taxes remained delinquent.

**Timber Sale, Klamath Indian Reservation.**—Sealed bids, in duplicate, marked outside "Bid Eggman Unit," and addressed to the Superintendent, Klamath Indian School, Klamath Agency, Oregon, will be received until twelve o'clock noon, Pacific time, Thursday, March 11, 1920, for the purchase of timber on 640 acres of tribal and allotted land on the Sprague River in Sections 22, 27 and 28, Township 34 South, Range 8 East of the W. M., Klamath Reservation. The sale comprises about two and one-half million feet of yellow pine, for which no bid of less than three dollars and ten cents (\$3.10) per thousand feet will be considered. All timber must be removed prior to July 1, 1921. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check for one thousand dollars, payable to the Superintendent of the Klamath Indian School. Deposit will be retained as liquidated damages if bidder fails to execute contract and bond within sixty days from acceptance of bid. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved.
