FIGURES ON OIL PRODUCTION

Considered in connection with the possibility that there is oil underlying the surface of Klamath county, the following statistics on oil production, prepared by a local man who has had considerable experience in oil development, are interesting reading:

August 28, 1859, on Oil creek, near Titusville, Pennsylvania, the first oil well in the United States was brought in at a depth of 69 feet, from which was pumped 40 barrels a day, this being the shallowest producing well of record. The deepest oil well is near Fairmont, West Virginia, being in excess of 7,500 feet, and at this depth had to be abandoned on account of a broken cable.

Timber Sale, Klamath Indian Reservation.—Sealed bids, in duplicate, marked outside "Bid Eggman Unit," and addressed to the Superintendent, Klamath Indian School, Klamath Agency, Oregon, will be received until twelve o'clock noon, Pacific time, Thursday, March 11, 1920, for the purchase of timber on 840 acres of tribal and allotted land on the Sprague River in Sections 22, 27 and 28, Township 34 South, Range 8 East of the W. M., Klamath Reservation. The sale comprises about two and one-half million feet of yellow pine, for which no bid of less than three dollars and ten cents (\$3.10) per thousand feet will be considered.
