BREAKS SILENCE AFTER 14 YEARS

HONOLULU, T. H., Feb. 7.—(By Mail.)—Antonio Reyes, Porto Rican bootblack, broke a self-imposed silence of 14 years in the police court here recently with the remark, "Not guilty." Reyes was charged with assault with a deadly weapon. He was convicted and given an hour in jail.

The Porto Rican has not spoken a word, his friends say, since one of his countrymen was hanged here for murder in 1904. He has allowed his hair and beard to grow, and generally has been regarded as an eccentric character.

Following his declaration of innocence, Reyes talked volubly in Spanish and English and has shown no disposition to return to his "dumb" habits.
