SWEDEN GIVES AID

TO NEEDY AUSTRIANS. STOCKHOLM, Jan. 28. (By Mail.)—More than 1,000,000 crowns have been collected by the committees in Sweden for the relief of the hungry and poorly clothed in Vienna. Several trainloads of supplies, food and clothing, have already been

dispatched to the Austrian capital, and money has also been sent. In addition 2,000 Viennese children have been brought here to receive food and care and will be kept through the summer. The foodstuffs forwarded to Vienna consist largely of American condensed milk and American flour.

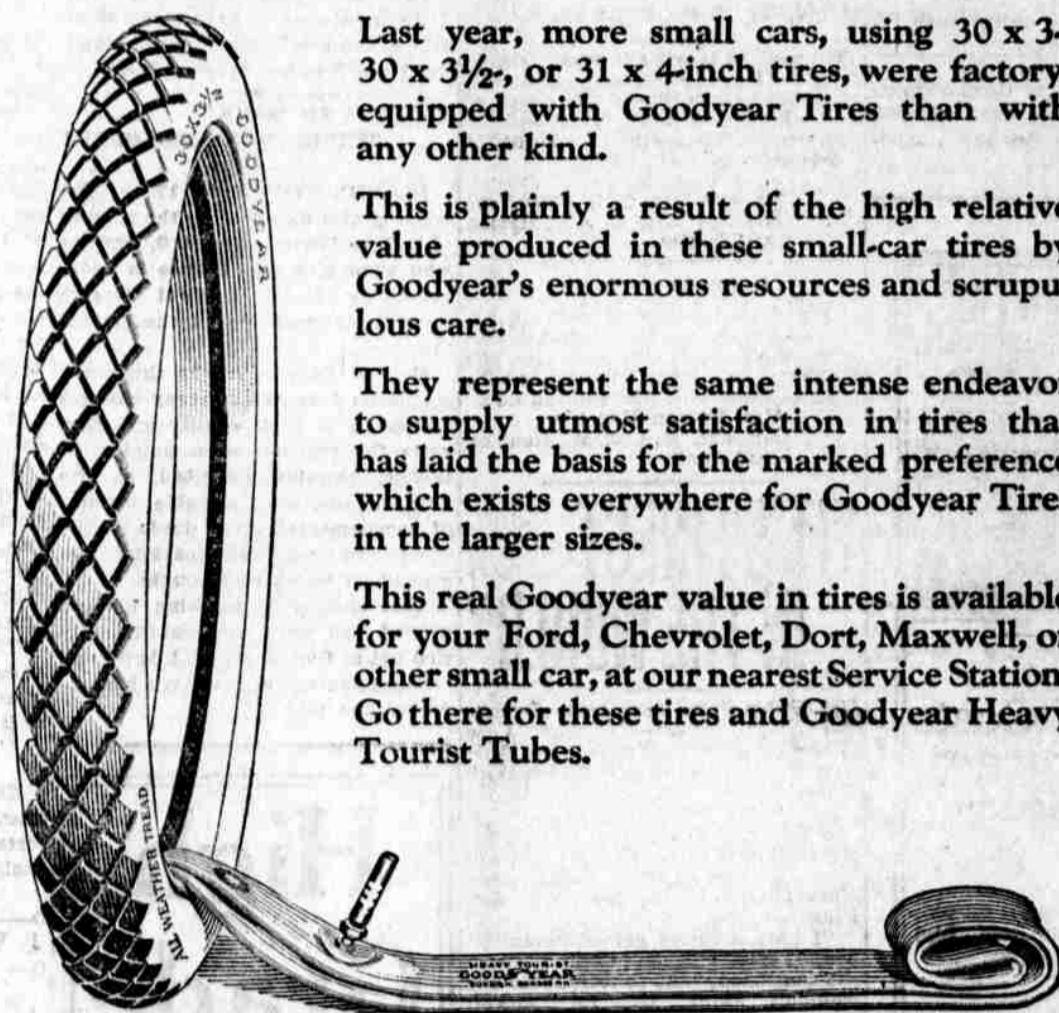
