**COURT REFUSES TO
FIX WIFE'S VALUE**

LONDON, Feb. 7. (By Mail).—
What is the cash value of a wife is a
question which agitated the London
divorce court for a time. Counsel
for the husband in a case, arguing
on the question of damages, said
that the old theory that a wife was a
chattel and that the jury had to
award damages to the owner of the
property still holds true "with some
slight modifications."
"Then you call her a quasi-chat-
tel," said the judge. The court found
the matter too heavy for hasty de-
cision and reserved judgment.

**STUDIES YELLOW FEVER.
MEXICO CITY, Feb. 9. (By Mail)**
—Doctor Nidez Noguichi, of Japan,

for two years engaged in research
work with the Rockefeller Institute
in New York, has set up extensive
laboratories in the state of Yucatan
for the purpose of studying the ori-
gin, prevention and cure of yellow
fever. The Mexican Academy of
Medicine has made him an honorary
member of the institution.

**AIR DEFENSE BIG
NEED, SAYS SOLDIER.**

MELBOURNE, Australia, Jan. 28.
(By Mail).—Major-General J. G.
Legge, head of the Australian Mil-
itary Aeronautic Service, is trying to
wake up Australians to the need of
preparation for air defense in case of
war. He declared in a recent speech
"Australia must fly or die, unless she
is willing to change her color from
white to yellow, brown or black."

**WILL FOSTER
TRADE WITH
NEAR EAST**

CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 2. (By
Mail).—The American Chamber of
Commerce for the Levant has under-
taken to organize a Levant House in
New York City for the mutual bene-
fit of business men and others, either
her or in America, who are inter-
ested in the Near East. The sugges-
tion originated with G. B. Ravndal,
American Commissioner and Consul
General here and honorary president
of the local Chamber of Commerce.

It is proposed to establish the Lev-
ant House along the lines of the
India House, one of the historic
clubs of New York, but with the modern
equipment of other well-known
business, engineering, or foreign
trade organizations already centered
in New York. One of its purposes
would be to record and commemorate
America's contribution to the ad-
vancement of civilization among
Egyptians, Arabs, Armenians, Turks,
Greeks and Bulgarians. Literary re-
search and lectures upon this topic
would be actively encouraged.

The American Chamber of Com-
merce for the Levant has named,
partly among its officers and direc-
tors at large, a group of active busi-
ness men in the United States to
whom it has entrusted the work of
carrying the Levant House scheme in-
to execution. These are: C. E. Ly-
decker, Ralph Milton Odell, Edward
Neville Vose, Lucien Irving Thomas,
Edward Ewing Pratt, E. C. Porter,
H. M. Hitchcock, H. M. Day, and
Harold Hoskins of New York City,
Herbert Adams Gibbons of Prince-
ton, W. T. Ellis of Philadelphia and
Luther Fowle of Boston.

It is believed that the movement
will be furthered also by men like
Cleveland H. Dodge, James A. Par-
rell, Arthur B. Farquhar, E. H. Hux-
ley and C. H. Minor, life members of
the American Chamber of Commerce
for the Levant, and Henry Morgen-
thau, Abram J. Elkus and William C.
Redfield, honorary members of the
chamber.

**SECRET OF SMOKE
SCREENS REVEALED**

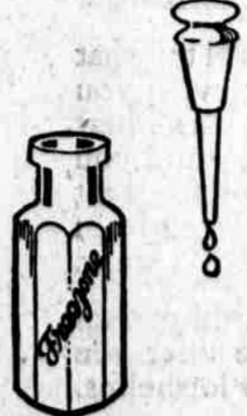
LONDON, Feb. 9. (By Mail).—
The secret of the smoke screens used
with such great success by the Brit-
ish Navy in the raids on Ostend and
Zeebrugge is definitely disclosed.
They were produced from an acid,
which has to be burned in the pres-
ence of a sufficient amount of water
vapor, otherwise the smoke produc-
ed, even over the sea, is liable to be
somewhat thin on a dry day.

Commander Brock, who sacrific-

devised the plan to feed the acid in
a fine spray into the funnel of a des-
troyer, where the temperature was
sufficient to vaporise the acid, and
the water vapor present completed
the formation of the cloud.
