These drugs and chemicals are classified and catalogued in two books, known as The United States Pharmacopoeia and The National Formulary. In the compounding and dispensing of prescriptions and formulae we shall use only such drugs and chemicals as are entitled to listing in these books, and drugs of governments and standard by in these books, or drugs of equal standard where no standard is specified by these authorities for a given drug or chemical. No adulterations or substitutions of any kind whatever will be tolerated in our prescription compounding and dispensing depart-



If it be said that government (or municipal) conduct of business has sometimes been successful, the answer is that the same business in the hands of private, responsible individuals, with capital and success at stake, would have resulted more favorably.
