**RESOLUTION**

The City Engineer, pursuant to the resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having under date of the 8th day of August, 1919, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Washington Street from First Street, easterly, to Third Street, including intersections; and the Common Council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory;

It is hereby resolved, that said plans, specifications, and estimates for the improvement of Washington Street from First Street, easterly, to Third Street, including intersections, be and the same are hereby approved;

And be it further resolved, that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of Washington Street, in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates; said improvement to consist of paving said portions of Washington Street with cinders, oil macadam, bitulthic or other hard surfaced pavement. The estimated cost of the improvement of said portions of said streets by placing thereon cinder pavement to be \$7,590.00; and the estimated cost of paving said streets with oil macadam, including cement sidewalks, curbing and grading, to be \$8,735.00; the estimated cost of improving said portions of Washington Street with bitulthic pavement, including grading, rolling, curbing and cement sidewalks to be \$11,155.00.

And be it further resolved by the Common Council, that the following described property be and is hereby declared benefited by said improvement, to-wit:

- Lots 1-2 of Block 11,
- Lots 5-8 of Block 4,
- Lots 1-2-3-4-5 of Block 10,
- Lots 6-7-8-9-10 of Block 5;
- Lots 1-2-3-4-5 of Block 9,
- Lots 6-7-8-9-10 of Block 6,

All of said Lots and Blocks above described being in Ewauna Heights Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, and that said property above listed and described be and hereby is declared to be the property to be assessed for the expense of said improvement;
