**PLENTY TO DRINK ACROSS THE LINE**

JUAREZ, Mex., Mar. 8.—During the "eleventh-hour" rush of liquor exportation from El Paso to Juarez last month, immediately preceding the coming into effect of the prohibition amendment of the American federal constitution, \$146,646 worth of spirituous liquors was shipped into Juarez from the American side according to statistics just made

public by the American consulate here.

The total of imports from the United States for the month was \$756,835. Besides liquor, other large items were machinery, \$191,375, and coal and coke, \$139,500.

Exports from Juarez into the United States totaled \$42,642, the principal items being lumber, \$15,960; corn, \$10,527; silver bullion, \$4,036; green hides, \$2,454; and ore \$1,175.
