ARGENTINA WHEAT EXPORT, 1919, HUGE.

BUENOS AIRES, Feb. 14. (By Mail.)—The value of Argentine wheat exported during the last year rose to the unprecedented figure equivalent to about \$182,500,000, according to statistics made public today by the Ministry of Agriculture. The tonnage exported amounted to 3,088,295.

La Epoca says the average ship-board quotation for the cereal for 1919—based on the price on the dates of exportation—was \$5.93 a 100 kilograms (of 2.20 pounds each.)

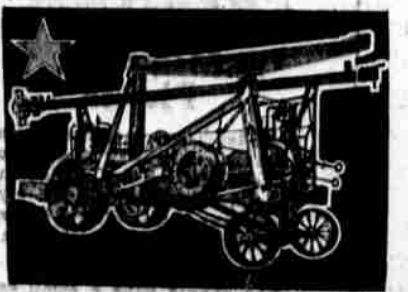
