MANY COMING TO TRADE CONVENTION

SAN FRANCISCO, March 24.—More than 1,200 delegates already have been accredited from the United States and from abroad to the seventh national foreign trade convention here May 12-15, 1920, the Pacific coast committee in charge has announced. An attendance of at least twice that number is assured, it was said. Delegates will be brought to the convention from American points by three special trains routed over the northern, middle west and southern routes. The general theme for the convention will be "The Effect of Being a Creditor Nation," according to James A. Farrell, chairman of the National Foreign Trade Council. All of the large cities on the Pacific have joined in preparing for the gathering.
