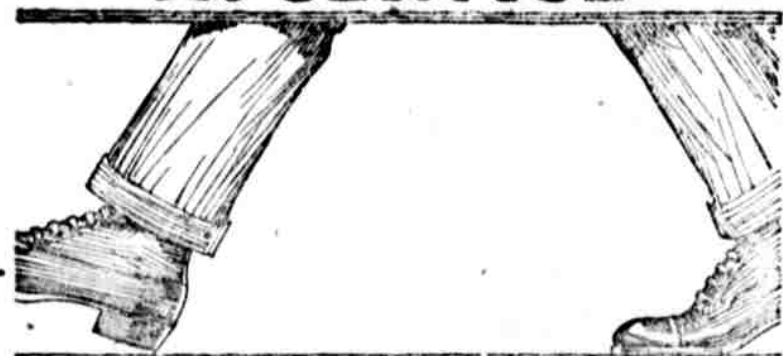

AMERICAN GOLD SUPPORTS H. C. L.

LONDON, Feb. 22. (By Mail).—The present high cost of food in Europe is attributed by Sir Auckland Goddes, President of the Board of Trade, to the fact that there is an enormous accumulation of gold in America, which he estimated at roughly nine times more than before the war. In an address at the Victoria Working Men's Club he said currency had gone down with a bang. That was what they meant when they said that cost of living had advanced. Until the gold now in America began to flow to this country a fall in the cost of living could not be expected, said Sir Auckland. There was only one solution of the present position, and that was that somehow this country would have to largely increase its volume of production. This, he said, would bring about a fall in prices of commodities.

"RAILROAD OPERATION BY RAILROAD MEN"

"A first problem of the railroads is the restoration of efficiency and courtesy." This statement is typical of many in editorial comment on the resumption of private control of the railways. Judging by the number of newspapers quoting it the following editorial from the New York World struck a responsive chord:

"There is now a possibility of railroad operation by railroad men. We have had railroad operation by land-grant boomers, by politicians, by Legislatures, by grantors, by bureaucrats, by Congress, by bankers and finally by government. Which was worst it would be hard to say, but all have been unsatisfactory. Although in this welter of greed and power a race of great railroad men disappeared, to be succeeded in many cases by bank clerks and favorites, it must be that there are men skilled in management and capable of administering these properties financially and physically in a way just to public, investors and employees. When it is found that experience and knowledge are needed in the operation of railroads, the talent which the old order has contemptuously set aside and which no doubt still exists should be in urgent demand."

REED COLLEGE WILL MAKE OIL TESTS

PORTLAND, Mar. 25.—Tractor operators, auto dealers and other users of lubricating oils can secure expert advice on their lubricating oil troubles from the physics department of Reed college, where tests of practically every oil sold in Oregon are now being made.

Tests for auto oils, prepared by Dr. A. A. Knowlton, head of the physics department, include a determination of "viscosity," which is most important. In this test, the oil is experimented on to determine how its stickiness changes with the rise in temperature from the time the engine starts until it attains normal heat. The most satisfactory oils have the least change in viscosity. A large number of tests have already been made, and the department will test other oils which they have not already examined.

The Reed college oil tests have aroused much interest among oil dealers. Student testers have appeared before tractor conventions and farmers' institutes at O. A. C. and other institutions. One Portland oil concern has installed a laboratory in its plant where Reed physics students make the tests devised by Dr. Knowlton.

CONVICT SAVES LIFE OF HATED FOREMAN

PHOENIX, Ariz., Mar. 25.—How a physically powerful Mexican convict saved the life of the foreman he disliked at the risk of his own life is a story P. R. Milnes, private secretary to Governor Campbell, has brought here on his return from a trip to the state penitentiary at Florence, Ariz.

The convict, Pete Salinas, serving a term for burglary, had a grudge against his foreman of the road construction gang, "Sherry" McDonald, because of the discipline which the foreman had to impose, according to Secretary Milnes. On the other hand, Salinas was considered troublesome, powerful enough to be a source of danger, and spilling under restraint.

His act of heroism came one day just after a premature explosion knocked Foreman McDonald unconscious. Salinas who was out of the danger zone, rushed in and, before all the rock had stopped falling, threw his own body on top of that of the foreman.

A rock fell on Salinas' head and dazed him, the secretary said, but, realizing another blast was due to explode immediately, the convict struggled to his feet, picked up the still unconscious foreman and dragged him out of danger.
