Mr. and Mrs. M. Motschenbacher and son, Arnold, have returned from three months' visit in Los Angeles and other parts of California.

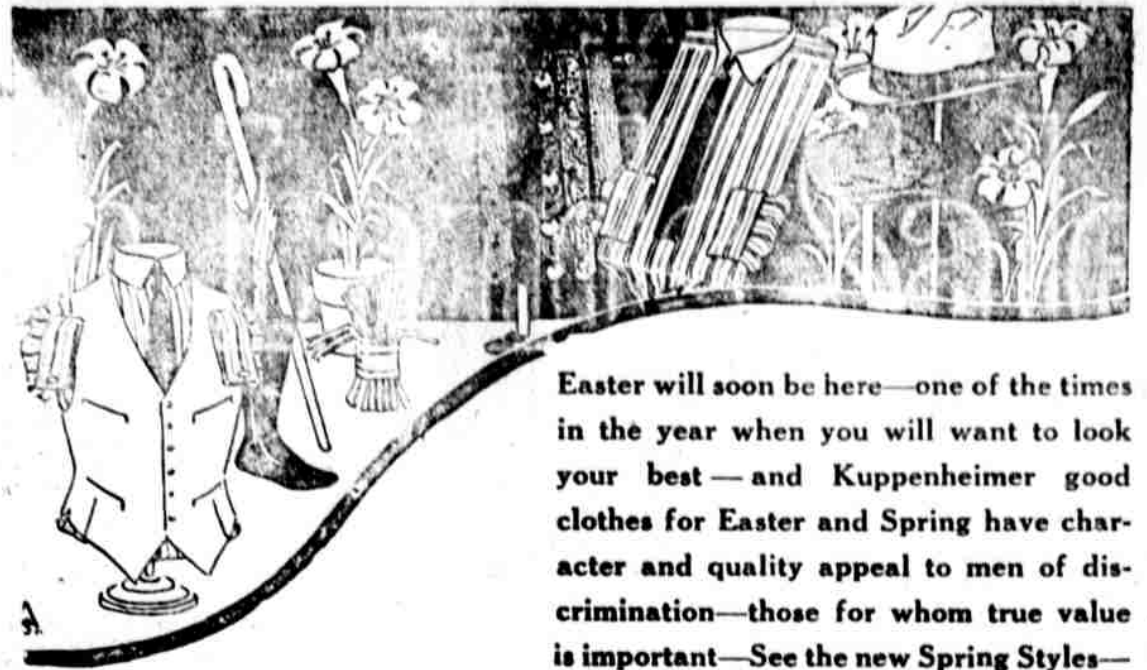
Mrs. Clara Cornish, who has been slightly ill since Sunday, is recovering.

RESOLUTION ON COLLECTION OF PAVING ASSESSMENTS

Whereas, it satisfactorily appears to the Common Council from the showing of the Police Judge, that there are a large number of property owners who are delinquent from one to eight installments on liens docketed against their properties for the improvement of Main Street from the bridge to the Depot and on Sixth street from Main to Kinlock avenue. And, whereas, it further appears that bonds issued on such improvements will fall due May 1st, 1921, which renders imperative the necessity for forcing prompt payment of such delinquent paving assessments.

It is further resolved by the Common Council, that the Police Judge and the City Attorney be and they hereby are directed and ordered to proceed at once to notification of such delinquencies and request for prompt payment, and that in default of such payment the said officials shall proceed on and after the 10th day of September, 1920, to advertise the property against which such delinquencies exist for sale in accordance with the provisions of the charter relating thereto. 25
