ENVIES LIBERTY OF AMERICAN WOMEN

BUENOS AIRES, Feb. 25. (By Mail.)—Dr. Alicia Moreau, a social worker widely known in South America, who has recently returned

from Washington, has been telling the Argentine women that the women of the United States enjoy more liberty than those of any other country and urging them to "awake from their lethargy and take lessons from their sisters in North America." She declared in an address the other day that women of the United States "ought about prohibition, that they have 'revolutionized their nation through work and propaganda and are now in such a strong position that they are bound to attain even greater heights of independence.'"

CHEAPER AIR RATES

LONDON, March 4. (By Mail.)—It is now possible to hire an airplane privately for two shillings and sixpence a mile.

The cost of a journey by air to the Riviera is given as £91; to St. Moritz, Switzerland, £60 and to Copenhagen £87.

The Riviera trip by air takes seven hours, compared with more than thirty hours by land and sea.

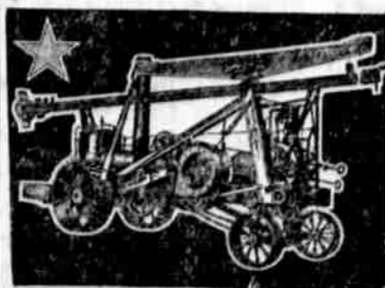
