REFUSE TO RATIFY SUFFRAGE AMENDMENT

JACKSON, Mar. 31.—The lower house of the Mississippi legislature again refused today to ratify the Susan B. Anthony suffrage amendment. The vote was 94 to 23. The measure passed the senate yesterday.

LONDON, Mar. 31.—The house of commons passed a second reading of the Home Rule bill today by a vote of 8 to 94.

REBELS REINFORCED

THE HAGUE, March 31.—The army of rebellious German workmen that is besieging the fortress at Wesel, Rhenish Prussia, has received reinforcements and made new attacks, according to dispatches to the Nieuwe Courant of Rotterdam. Towns in Westphalia are reported to have been plundered. The advisers stated that a general strike had been proclaimed at Essen.
