Sealed bids will be received by the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, until Monday, the 10th day of May, 1920, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m. of said day, at the City Hall in the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, at which time and place proposals to purchase will be opened and considered, for the purchase of \$50,735.00 City of Klamath Falls General Obligation bonds, payable 20 years from date of issue, bearing a rate of interest not to exceed 6 per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, principal and interest payable at the Oregon Fiscal Agency in New York, state of New York, or at the office of the Treasurer of said City as determined by the purchaser and the Common Council. With Paul Little, 12-year-old son of E. R. Little, Lexington, Ky., capitalist, safe at home, the authorities are searching for two men who kidnaped the lad and held him for \$25,000 ransom for 36 hours locked in the bathroom of a Lexington hotel. The boy's rescue came when he managed to get to a telephone in the hotel room in the kidnapers' absence and tell his mother where he was. The father previously had left \$25,000 in cash in an ash can in a street in Lexington, but the kidnapers did not go to get it. Paul was half starved when found. He says his kidnapers threatened to shoot him if he made any noise and told him the most terrible murder stories.

Has Backing of Social Democrats in Forming New German Cabinet

Following the resignation of Premier Bauer's cabinet, which was said to be due to pressure from the German labor federation, Hermann Mueller, the foreign minister, was announced that Herr Mueller consented in deference to the unanimous wish of the entire Social Democratic party. The labor federation had been extremely discontented with the government's attitude since its return from Stuttgart.

The first woman regularly qualified to practice law in Missouri was Miss Helena Barkaloo of St. Louis. Miss Barkaloo was admitted to practice in 1870. When she died a few months later the members of the St. Louis bar held a memorial meeting in her honor, the first meeting of its kind ever held in the United States in honor of the memory of a woman member of the legal profession.
