CORNING (Tehama Co.), April 10.—C. D. Hill, of the Bank of Corning, has received word from Boston that the first car of Arizona wool has brought 80 cents in the grease.

Last year the price that prevailed for the first shipment of like wool was 60 cents.

With this rate prevailing, the Corning section will receive something like \$700,000 for her wool this spring—as many flocks are in this locality.
