### NOTICE INVITING PROPOSALS TO PURCHASE SEWER BONDS

Sealed bids will be received by the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, until Monday, the 10th day of May, 1929, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m. of said day, at the City Hall in the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, at which time and place proposals to purchase will be opened and considered, for the purchase of \$50,725.00 City of Klamath Falls General Obligation bonds, payable 20 years from date of issue, bearing a rate of interest not to exceed 6 per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, principal and interest payable at the Oregon Fiscal Agency in New York, state of New York, or at the office of the Treasurer of said City as determined by the purchaser and the Common Council. These bonds are to be issued in denominations of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00) each, and to be numbered from one (1) to fifty-one (51) inclusive.

Said bonds are to be issued in pursuance of Ordinance No. 498 of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon.

Said bonds are to be issued for the purpose of installation of a Sewer System in the territory known as Mills Addition of said city, in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Police Judge of said city. Each proposal to purchase said bonds must be accompanied by a check of 5 per cent of the amount of proposal, certified by some responsible bank payable to the City of Klamath Falls. ### PANAMA ASKS U. S. TO WITHDRAW TROOPS

PANAMA, Mar. 27. (By Mail)—The United States government has been asked through diplomatic channels immediately to withdraw from the Panama province of Chiriqui a detachment of 29 men of the 33rd Infantry under the command of Major Herbert E. Pace. The troops have been stationed there owing to the litigations American land owners have pending in the provincial courts. Residents of the province are very much disturbed by their presence.

Justice Alfaro, government secretary, commenting on the affair to the Associated Press correspondent said:

"Panama is more friendly to the United States than any other republic south of the Rio Grande and we cannot understand why armed occupation is necessary here when the United States administration does not find it necessary to intervene in Mexico where women are being violated and men are being murdered and mutilated every day."

### VILLAGE NOTABLES BANDED TO STEAL

VIENNA, Mar. 15. (By Mail)—A clergyman, Thomas Pfefferkorn, alleged to be the leader of a band of 25 thieves and incendiaries, has been arrested with his followers at the town of Mitterseil, according to the Salzburger Volksblatt. Pfefferkorn, the paper says, recruited his followers from among persons of some standing in the town of Mitterseil, including the photographer, the schoolmaster, the postmaster and the postmistress, and the letter carrier. They are alleged to have burglarized the inn and then set fire to it and to have practiced blackmail on a number of prominent citizens.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of Klamath Avenue from Ninth Street to Eleventh Street be, and the same are hereby approved.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve Klamath Avenue from Ninth Street to Eleventh Street in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates, said improvements to consist of paving said portions of said streets with bitulithic pavement at an estimated cost, including cement sidewalks, curbing and grading, of \$6898.00; oil macadam pavement at an estimated cost, including cement sidewalks, curbing and grading, of \$5085.00; said improvements in either event to include grading, rolling and curbing; said pavement to be full width (52 feet wide) with sidewalk 6 feet wide on both sides thereof.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL, that the property hereinafter described be, and hereby is declared to be benefited, to-wit:
