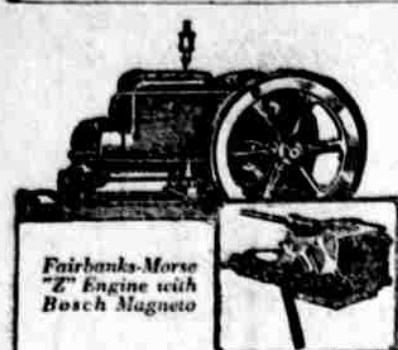

FARM WORKERS WAGE IS HIGH

Farm labor in Oregon is demanding from \$100 a month, and board, up, according to a survey report just issued by F. L. Kent, field agent of the U. S. department of agriculture. In consequence farmers are trying to do their own work. Winter wheat is estimated 310,000 bushels short of last year's production. The detailed report of the field agent follows:

Winter Wheat—A condition of 91.0 per cent for Oregon and of 75.6 per cent for the U. S. on April 1, indicates a probable production of 15,700,000 bushels in Oregon, and a total U. S. crop of 483,617,000 bushels for the 1920 harvest. Last year's crop was estimated at 16,010,000 bushels for Oregon, and 731,636,000 bushels for the U. S. Two years ago the crop was 10,795,000 bushels in Oregon, and 565,099,000 bushels for the nation.

In the state the 10 year average condition figure April 1 is 95.0 per cent. The 10-year average for the U. S. is 81.4 per cent. Dry weather early last fall and resulting late seeding, together with rather unfavorable conditions for spring growth are factors tending to the low average condition in the state. Somewhat similar conditions exist throughout the country, with the added factor of heavy damage from the Hessian fly in some states. It is reported that considerable acreage has already been plowed in some middle western states. A reduction of 24.0 per cent in the acreage sown last fall as compared with the seeding of a year ago last fall, is also a big factor in the estimated total production.

Rye—In Oregon rye is grown as a forage crop, and comparatively little of the acreage annually sown is matured and threshed. The condition of the crop on April 1, is reported as 94.0 per cent compared with a 10-year average of 97.0 per cent. The area seeded last fall is estimated at 59,000 acres. The U. S. April 1 condition figure is reported as 88.8 per cent, compared with 90.6 per cent a year ago, and a 10-year average of 82.0 per cent. Total production in the U. S. for 1920 is placed at 75,841,000 bushels. The 1919 crop was 88,478,000 bushels, and the 1918 crop 91,041,000 bushels.

Farm Labor Supply—The shortage in farm labor supply appears to be nationwide. Reports indicate that the situation is a bit less favorable in Oregon than in the country as a whole. The supply this year as compared with a normal is reported as 78.0 per cent for Oregon, and 72.14 per cent for the U. S. The supply this year as compared with a year ago also shows considerable deficiency, the figures being given as 95.0 per cent for the state and 87.3 per cent for the U. S.

Considerable comment on the farm labor situation was made by the regular reporters to this office for the April 1 report, some of which is as follows:

Baker County—There will be some shortage of work done on account of high wages. The common laborer that has no family is getting too

much money per day for his work. Many are loafing around pool halls and other places about half of their time making a shortage of labor.

Clackamas County—Farm labor is almost impossible to procure at any price the farmer can afford to pay, so the farmer does what he can himself and makes out without help.

Coos County—Farm labor is practically not available at prices that the business will stand.

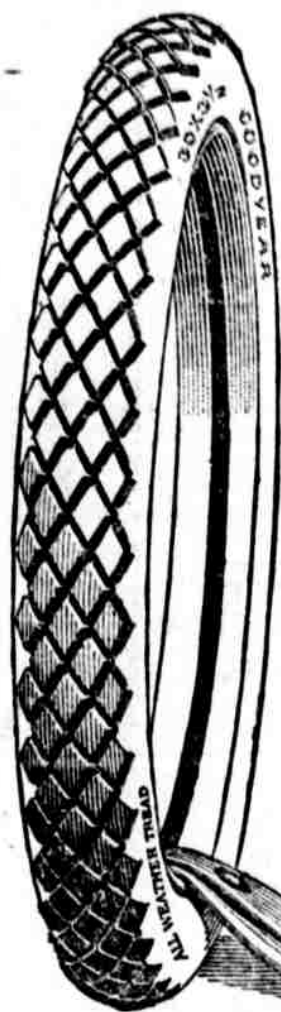
Douglas County—The labor supply is inadequate to meet the requirements for higher production, and wages are prohibitive, from \$5 to \$6 per day being demanded. The producers are going it alone as best they can.

Jefferson County—Good help hard to get, besides farmers are not in a position to hire much at present wages. Wages higher than at any time during the war.

Klamath County—Farm labor demanding \$100 per month and board. Factories and logging camps using many men. Farmers in some cases unable to secure help.

Malheur County—The farm is down and out so far as help is concerned. Street paving, state road building, and other public activities, together with extremely high wages

PLENTY OF NAILS FOR BUILDING, MAKERS SAY

PITTSBURG, Apr. 13.—By increasing the production of nails 15 per cent, steel mills in the Pittsburgh district have eliminated fear of a shortage.

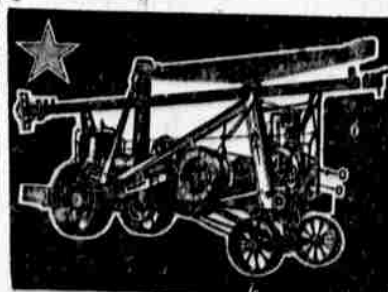
