PARAGUAY LAND OF OPPORTUNITY

BUENOS AIRES, Mar. 27. (By Mail).—Paraguay is a land of wonderful opportunity for North Americans, says W. L. Schurz, United States trade commissioner who has just completed a seven months' investigation of its resources. Ten million dollars in American money has thus far been invested in the little republic but in the opinion of Mr. Schurz, millions more of American capital would find a profitable return there.

Nearly the size of the state of Missouri and with less than 1,000,000 inhabitants, Paraguay has untouched resources of amazing variety and possibilities. Mr. Schurz told a correspondent of the Associated Press.

"Over half the country is forested with the finest hard woods in the world," he said. "Its soil and climate are capable of raising anything under the sun, including wheat and bananas. Experiments have proved that more cotton to the acre can be raised on Paraguayan soil than on any other soil where cotton is cultivated at present. It is good for tobacco and sugar, it is good for anything.

"Oranges in Paraguay grow wild. You would not believe that only one out of every 100 oranges produced in Paraguay ever is eaten. But is is so. Billions of oranges lie on the ground and rot.

"There are deposits of manganese and iron of unknown extent that have not been worked since the Paraguayan war ended in 1870. It is waiting for a railroad to be built to it. There is also copper.

"The American investments in Paraguay at present are in cattle, meat packing plants and quebracho. There are less than 100 Americans in the whole country. They are popular with the natives who think a lot of the United States.

STEEPLEJACKS SAVE FRIEND FROM DEATH

SHEFFIELD, Eng., Mar. 5. (By Mail).—For applying artificial respiration to an unconscious steeplejack at the top of a 150-foot chimney, three men have been awarded the Edward medal for bravery.

The steeplejack and a boy assistant were painting the brickwork at the top of the chimney when the man was overcome by gas fumes. Whelpton, Naylor and Ball, recipients of the medal, who were not steeplejacks, ascended a ladder, climbed over the projecting chimney crown and applied artificial respiration to the unconscious man for 20 minutes. Then they lowered him to the ground in a canvas ambulance sling, which had been passed up by means of a rope.

It is not generally known that the list of living ex-Queens includes the name of the Infanta Mercedes, sister of King Alfonso XIII., who was Queen of Spain from the death of her father, Alfonso XII., to the birth of the present King. Altogether, she reigned 169 days, which is probably the shortest reign on record. The Salic law, which bars females from the accession to a throne, does not operate in Spain, and until the sex of Alfonso XII's posthumous child was determined, the eldest of his two daughters automatically succeeded him.

SOUTH SEA ISLAND LINKED WITH WORLD

PAGO PAGO, American Samoa, March 23. (By Mail).—The opening of a new ocean lane has brought into communication with the outside world Pitcairn Island, situated in the eastern part of the South Pacific, and island which, before the construction of the Panama Canal, perhaps, one of the most rarely visited places in the Seven Seas.

The Great Circle route from Panama to Australia passes directly by Pitcairn Island now and in consequence the once lonely islanders find themselves suddenly in close touch with the world events whereas, in times past they accounted themselves fortunate if in a year one or two ships visited their shores.

Pitcairn Island is inhabited by the descendants of the British sailors who more than 100 years ago by mutiny, seized the ship "Bounty" and setting their commander, captain Bligh, and his officers adrift in an open boat, returned to Tahiti and, having induced a company of natives to accompany them, sailed away to Pitcairn where they remained un-There are now forty families living on the island, all of them direct descendants of these mutinous white men and their Tahitian wives.

The island, lying just to the southward of the Tropic of Capricorn, has a semi-tropical climate and in consequence many of the fruits of the tropic and temperate zones flourish there. This fact makes it a grateful stopping place for vessels.

EXPLOITING JAPAN

TOKIO, Mar. 14. (By Mail).—A Japanese millionaire is planning to send an exhibition ship around the world to introduce Japan's products to foreign lands. The steamer is to be a 10,000-ton vessel reconstructed so as to afford room for exhibition shelves and rooms for entertainments, and is to start in April.
