WOOD FAMINE
FACES CITY

As the result of the closing of box
factories on account of car shortage
resulting from the freight embargo,
Klamath Falls faces a fuel famine,
which, if the strike keeps up, might
give local people a taste of what the
east went through during the soft
coal miners' strike last winter.

The Klamath Lumber & Box
company closed down yesterday noon
on account of the weather but is
running today and will run this week.
If the embargo is in effect Monday
they will probably close down until
the strike is broken.

The Ewauna is closed on account
of the embargo and other local box
plants are also reported closed.

S. P. WILL NOT
DEAL WITH OUTLAW

J. H. Dyer, general manager of
the Southern Pacific, denies any in-
tention of negotiations or compromise
with the outlaw union in a tele-
gram received by the local station
today, which reads:

"It has been called to my attention
that reports are being circulated and
statements made by organizers and
promoters of the outlaw movement
that they are soon to be given a
hearing by the Southern Pacific.
These reports and statements are
untrue and are made for no other
purpose than to mislead others into
joining or remaining with the move-
ment.

"This is to advise all concerned
that under no circumstances will the
Southern Pacific give a hearing to or
have any dealings with such organ-
izations."

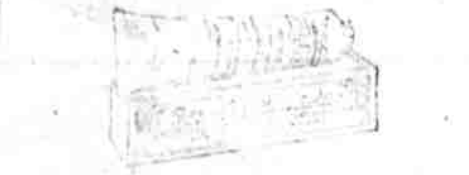

ager of the American Bell Telephone
company.

In the meantime, in 1890, Mr. Vail
retired from the telephone business
for many years. He purchased a
large farm at Lyndonville, Vt., and
interested himself in agriculture. In
1893 he made a trip to South Amer-
ica, and with his customary fore-

sight, saw the possibilities of the
Argentine republic. He obtained
from the government a concession
near Cordoba, built an electric power
station there, purchased a horse-car
line in Buenos Aires, converted it
into a trolley line, formed a company
and equipped it with the best cars
from the United States, bought out
all competing lines and gave the city
a complete modern service. The
company was composed largely of
British capitalists, and for some time
Mr. Vail had his headquarters in
London. When he retired from these

activities in 1904, he returned to
Vermont, but three years later he
was again called upon to enter the
telephone field as president of the
American Telephone & Telegraph
company, of which he had been the
first president. He retired from the
position last June.

VICTORY BUTTONS
FOR NAVY MEMBERS

Navy victory buttons will be dis-
tributed to discharged members of
the navy and the naval reserve force

beginning Monday, April 19th, ac-
cording to word just received by the
Red Cross from the naval recruiting
office in Portland, a naval officer
with a supply of those buttons will
arrive here at that time. Army vic-
tory buttons have been available for
some time and most service men
have secured one, the little bronze
or silver, star worn on the lapel of
civilian clothes being quite a familiar
sight. The navy, however, has just
recently decided upon a design and
very few men have as yet obtained a
button.

In response to inquiries on the
part of a number of ex-navy men
from this county, Miss Oleson, the
Red Cross worker, wrote to Portland
for information concerning the navy
victory button and as a result Lieu-
tenant Commander F. K. Elder will
bring in a supply. Every ex-navy
man should bring his discharge or
release to the Red Cross office as a
notation must be made on the origi-
nal certificate showing that the vic-
tory button has been issued.
