### FOREIGN LANDLORDS OBJECTS OF TAX

ROME, Mar. 27. (By Mail).—A tax would be imposed on property in Italy owned by foreigners not living in this country under the proposed new taxation and finance law which the government has laid before the chamber of deputies. This tax also would apply to Italy's stocks which such foreigners may hold.

Any money owed abroad by Italian subjects or companies also would be heavily taxed. Subscribers to the loan of 1920 and capital brought into

Italy after January 1 of this year would, however, be exempt from taxation.

The proposed tax on Italian stocks and shares held abroad is criticized by the financial expert of the Tribuna as unjust on the ground that this property already pays an income tax in the country where the owner is living. The paper points out that such a tax would be likely to discourage entrance of foreign capital into this country which is so necessary for Italy at this moment.

## WESTERN STATES PREPARING FOR THE PRIMARIES

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Apr. 23.—Selection of delegates to national party conventions holds the immediate interests of voters in the far western part of the United States, three states having presidential primary elections for that purpose, the others choosing delegates at state conventions.

The long series of campaigns, political gatherings and preliminary elections will culminate in the general election November 2 when in nearly all western states offices ranging from United States senatorships to county officers will be filled.

The direct and indirect issues range in character from contests between friends and opponents of the Non-Partisan League, prohibition and organized labor to the high cost of living and taxation.

Of the presidential primaries, the first comes in Montana April 23, followed by the California primary May 4 and the Oregon primary May 21.

### Arizona

A contest for the office of United States senator from Arizona will be a feature of the general election in Arizona on November 2. It will involve the seat of Senator Marcus A. Smith, whose term is expiring. At the same time, the offices of Governor and nearly all other state officers will be filled. There are a few exceptions. One member of the supreme court is to be chosen, together with one member of the corporation commission and two of the tax commission. Other members of the supreme court and of the two commissions remain in office, their term not being due to expire. Few aspirants for nomination for any office have yet announced themselves.

Both democrats and republicans selected delegates to their national conventions in February. Both sets of delegates are uninstructed, although the republican convention at Tucson adopted resolutions favoring Leonard Wood's candidacy.

### California

The contest between adherents of United States Senator Hiram W. Johnson and Herbert Hoover, former United States food administrator, both Californians, for this state's delegation to the republican national convention holds chief interest in the California presidential primary election May 4.

The two other party tickets to be voted upon, the democratic and prohibitionist, present no contest, the delegates being unopposed, the prohibition delegates being pledged to Henry Clay Needham of Los Angeles.

The state primary comes August 24, when candidates will be nominated for a United States senatorship, eleven seats in congress and a long list of state and county officers.

### Colorado

Colorado will hold its state primary election on September 14 for nomination of a United States senator, four congressmen, all state officers, eighteen state senators and 65 members of the state house of representatives in addition to county and district offices.

In addition to the election of national and state officers at the general election November 2, the voters will pass on at least four initiated and referred laws. Those so far filed with the secretary of state are: bond issue of \$350,000 for erection of a state psycho-pathic hospital; an old age pensions measure; a bill to limit the hours of employment of fire fighters and a bill for a separate licensing-board for chiropractors.

The republican state convention meets at Pueblo May 6 to select delegates to the national convention. The democrats state committee is to meet in Denver May 17 to fix a date for the state convention.

### Idaho

At the general election next November, Idaho citizens will elect a ticket ranging from United States senator to succeed John F. Nugent.
