CALLAUX SENTENCED TO PRISON AND BANISHMENT

PARIS, Apr. 23.—The sentence decided upon by the high court for former Premier Callaux, convicted yesterday of having correspondence and commercial relations with the enemy, is three years imprisonment, payment of costs of the trial and five years banishment with loss of civil rights for ten years. The actual jail sentence will be about one month, the court allowing the time that the former premier has been under arrest to be deducted from his sentence.

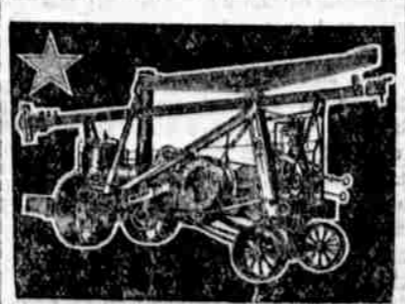
