VIOLINIST BUYS PALACE

VIENNA, March 28. (By Mail.)—Jan Kubelik, violinist, has just purchased a palace for 5,000,000 crowns. It is announced. A few weeks ago the palace was sold for 2,700,000 crowns. This is an example of the feverish speculation in real estate which has set in here because of pending financial legislation, particularly the proposed levy on the fortunes, and also because of the generally uncertain state of the country's finances. Many large properties in Vienna are reported to have changed hands as often as three times in one week. Palaces have been sold and resold until their prices have doubled.
