All the extensive "shots" needed were taken in the howling storm, to the great discomfort of the all-star troupe and camera force. Then it cleared, the huge sand dunes ceased rolling and it was necessary to bring forth the "wind machines" and finish up the job. Thanks to the real storm, Director T. Hayes Hunter took some wonderful scenes, something, he claims, never before equalled in the history of motion pictures. And the beauty of it is, the audience at the Liberty Theatre can sit "amid all the comforts of home" and still live through a desert terror.
