### CALIFORNIA TO AID UPLIFT OF IMMIGRANTS

SAN FRANCISCO, April 29.—John Collier, New York City's immigrant education expert, has been appointed director of community organization in California for the newly appointed state committee of Public Agencies for Americanization, the first statement of the committee's plans and activities issued here today announced.

The committee, appointed by Governor Stephens, combines the state commission of Immigration and Housing, the state board of education and the University of California extension division into one unit for the purpose of supervising the work of immigrant education.

California is said to be the first state to place the Americanization problem under a unified directing body. This is said to be the first endeavor in the United States to work out on a state wide basis the community organization plan, hitherto established in only three cities.

Already California has started actual demonstrations of community organization in San Francisco, Los Angeles, Oakland and Fresno, the committee announced.

This state, according to the committee, "faces the acute dilemma of having to enforce a compulsory part-time education law for aliens, including night classes in English and citizenship, without any additional appropriation to finance the work."

"To solve this difficulty this committee," its statement today said, "has embarked upon the task of stimulating community organization, centering recreational, social, hygienic and educational activities around the school. By this plan part-time night teachers may act as club and recreational leaders as well and ultimately receive a portion of their income from the self-supporting local club. Moreover, the added interest taken by the immigrant will greatly increase the attendance of

the night classes. Instead of being purely compulsory, such attendance will be voluntary.

Immediate plans were outlined by the committee as follows:

"1. The training of teachers and social workers for the joint task of teaching immigrants in classes, and leading the activities of the community groups. This amounts to the creation of a new profession in California.

"All experience shows that Americanization work has to be done by professional workers, not by amateurs. It is also clear that the work should be done, if not wholly by the state, at least in friendly co-operation with the state agencies. The use of the term 'Americanization' to disguise various other lines of action by private interests can only be regarded as a menace to our national well being.

"2. The organization of the first California specimens of community organization to serve as demonstrations for the entire state.

"The first of these purposes, the training of expert leaders is already partially achieved. This has been done through the Americanization Institutes held in recent months in Los Angeles, Fresno and San Francisco and now in progress in Oakland. Other such institutes are planned for other cities in the state and will be a large part of the summer sessions of the University of California, both at Berkeley and Los Angeles. Considerable understanding of this work is also being spread through the state Conference of Social Agencies which convenes May 5-8 at Riverside.
