OREGON LEADS


SAN FRANCISCO, May 4 .- Treasury department reports received by the federal reserve bank of San Francisco show that residents of the twelfth federal reserve district invested \$1,382,267 in Thrift and War Savings Stamps and Treasury Savings Certificates during the first 60 days of 1920, or a per capita investment of 20 cents on the basis of the 1910 census report. This places the district second among the 11 other federal reserve districts in per capita investment, with the fourth, or Cleveland, Ohio, district leading. The total investment in these securities for the sixty day period throughout the United States and its possessions was \$13,278,789.80.
