### BORAH ASKS \$300,000,000 FOR SOLDIER RELIEF

WASHINGTON, May 11.—Soldier relief legislation, departing radically from all proposals before the house, was introduced in the senate by Senator Borah today. It proposes to make available \$300,000,000 during the next 10 years for loans to all honorably discharged men.
