MAMMOTH'S TOOTH

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., May 13—The tooth of a mammoth, an animal of a species that, according to Prof. Robert W. Ellis of the University of New Mexico, became extinct 15,000 years ago, was found in a gravel pit on the outskirts of Albuquerque the other day. The mammoth, Prof. Ellis said, belonged to the elephant primigenius, or elephant family. It was at maturity from 10 to 14 feet in height and had tusks much larger than the elephant. The lower part of the surface of the tooth found here is about four inches wide, eight inches long and about seven and a half inches high.

LABOR SOLIDLY BEHIND HIGHER EDUCATION TAX

While the radical element of I. W. W. propagandists have combined to defeat the bill for higher education to be voted on May 21st, all unions throughout the state have voted unanimous approval of the relief measure for the three state institutions, the University of Oregon at Eugene, the Agricultural College at Corvallis and the Monmouth Normal School at Monmouth, Oregon.

The following labor organizations have lined up solid for the bill: Central Labor Council, Klamath Falls, Oregon; Brotherhood of Painters, Decorators and Paperhangers of America; Salem Local Number 724; Grainhandlers Union of Portland, Local Number 384; Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks of Portland, Local 419; International Union of Timberworkers of Wheeler, Local Number 126; University Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America, Astoria Local 780; Capital Typographical Union Number 210 of Salem; International Union of Timberworkers of Bend, Local Number 19; Eugene Typographical Union Number 496; Steam Operating Engineers of Portland, Local Number 87.

The organized labor of Oregon realizes that the soul of American patriotism and ideals owes its development to the contribution of higher education. If the millage bill known on the ballot as 310 (x) yes should fail, it would mean the triumph of radicalism in Oregon.

BERLIN CRIME ON INCREASE

BERLIN, April 21. (By Mail)—In these disturbed days when the "revolution profiteer"—the successor of the war profiteer—flaunts his newly acquired wealth in the face of an impoverished populace, robberies and burglaries in Berlin increase at an abnormal pace. Street signs are full of announcements offering rewards for the return of stolen goods, and in one of the main business streets of Berlin a fancy goods store displays this notice: "Gentlemen burglars are requested not to break open the shop front nor to tamper with the locks. There is nothing to steal here. All property is removed from the shop windows at night."

There have been scores of hold-ups, and the other day a man was stripped of his clothes, shoes and hat and left on the sidewalk in his underclothes. It is not safe for hotel guests to leave any portable property of any description in their rooms. Articles of clothing have a way of vanishing into thin air, and hotel proprietors decline all responsibility. Police statistics indicate that the number of hotel robberies has tripled within the last five years.

To leave typewriters unpadlocked is sheer culpable negligence on the part of the owner. The Berlin criminal police has been obliged to organize a special department dealing exclusively with stolen machines. Cases of housebreaking have quadrupled within the last three years. Articles of clothing, bedclothes, carpets and curtains are the objects most desired by the thieving fraternity.
