The numbers enrolled at the cam pus-not including medical students. law students, extension students summer course students, short course students, farmer's week students or any other except regular four-year students resident at the institutions themselves—were as follows: 1914. 2.162; 1920, 5,408. An increase of 150 per cent.

As against this increase in resident full term enrollment the figures for the taxes levied for 1914 and 1919 for the identical purposes contemplated by the existing millage: 1914, \$986,505; 1919, \$1,214,929. An increase of 22 per cent.
